Match the first two Serial# digits to the year and month on the chart above

If your JX-10 Serial# is 684372 it's birthday is July 1986

If your MKS-70 Serial# is 7723193 it's birthday is April 1987

This numbering scheme was abandoned in 1990

The first 2 digits of the serial number show the birthday. The last 4 digits of the serial number show the number of units produced up to that point in time. To see if this is accurate, I polled random serial numbers of ten JX-10's and ten MKS-70's and the scheme fits. The Production Unit# always increases in value over time;

If this numbering scheme is true then;

JX-10 S/N: 757734 was the 7734th JX-10 manufactured since inception
MKS-70 S/N: 793906 was the 3906th MKS-70 manufactured since inception
